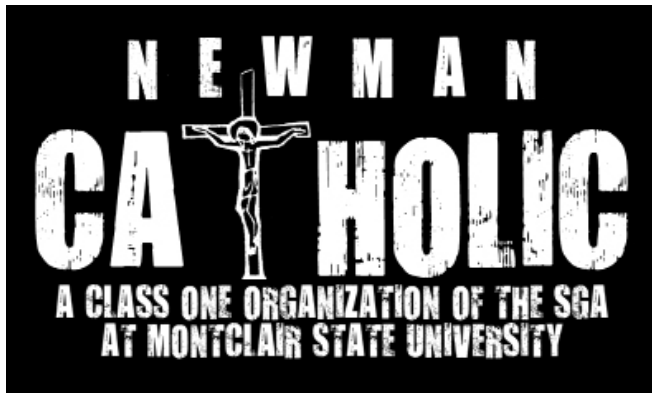

Mission trip applications open

This year, Newman Catholic is sponsoring two mission trips over the MSU Spring Break. Sean and Fr. Jim will lead one trip to Eastern Kentucky, and Sophie and Darin will lead another one to General Cepeda, Mexico through FOCUS Missions.

On the Kentucky trip, students will work with Christian Appalachian Project's WorkFest program, which attracts college students from all over the country. Primarily, the work will involve construction projects to provide housing improvements for the impoverished in the the area. Eastern Kentucky is in the middle of the Appalachian mountains, and some of the counties in the area are among the poorest in the nation. Students will encounter non-urban poverty, but will also be able to understand a

different way of life for a different culture. There will be daily Mass, group prayer and reflection, and opportunity to pray with the men and women they are helping. Applications for the trip are due on November 4th, and all students attending will be responsible for raising \$500 for the trip.

On the Mexico trip, FOCUS will partner with Family Mission Company to serve desert communities surrounding the town of General Cepeda, Mexico. Students will participate in some construction, as well as visit homes of elderly and home bound people, lead prayer services for rural communities, and pray with the local Mexican people.

Included in the trip will be a "desert day" of personal prayer in the Mexican wilderness, and a day visiting the city of Saltillo, home to a
