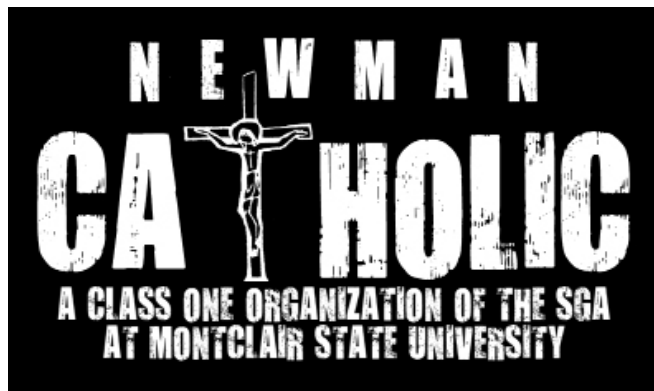
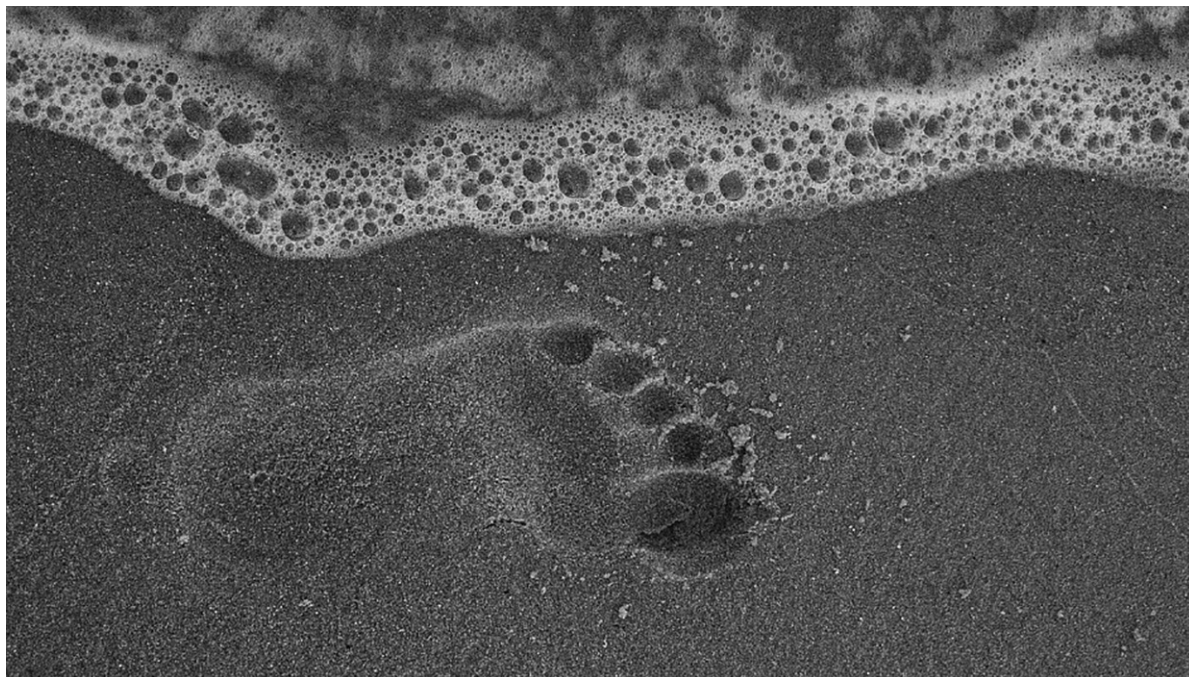

I had the privilege and the honor of going to England for my mission trip this past spring break. I have been on mission before when I went to New Mexico with two other Newman members from MSU two years ago, and I was under the impression that every mission trip had the same template: get the schedule ahead of time, know exactly where you were going, what you were going to do when you got there, etc. For me, I am the type of person that needs to know every detail of anything I'm involved in, and when things are not revealed to me early on, I get very anxious.
